Supplies in kit

- decorated paper for the kite
- string

What you'll need from home

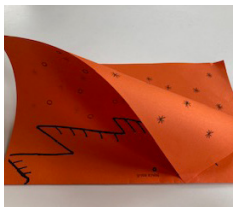
- stapler
- tape
- hole punch

Directions

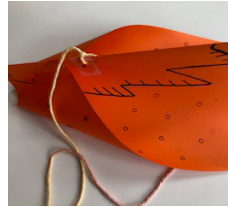
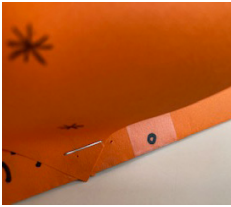
1. Fold the paper in half as pictured.



2. Gently pull the upper corner down and glue it to the small black dash on the side of Windy; repeat the step on the other side. The glue helps keep the corners in place so that they can be stapled together. Staple the layers together.



3. Next, add tape over the dot where the hole will be, to reinforce the area. Punch the hole, and tie on the string as pictured.



4. Now it's time to go outside for a run to see how high Windy will fly!
