BUILD A BIPLANE!

This little plane may not be a highflier, but it sure looks like it could take off!



Supplies in kit

- 2 large craft sticks
- 1 mini craft stick
- 1 clothespin

What you'll need from home

- liquid school glue
- markers or watercolor paint

Directions

1. Tint/decorate the craft sticks and clothespin on all sides. I colored mine with water-soluble markers and brushed them with water to blend the colors, but you can fly high with your own designs, lettering, glitter, stickers - whatever you like! If you use watercolor paint, be sure to let the craft sticks dry completely before gluing.



2. When you have finished decorating your aircraft's elements, begin by gluing the wings and small tail piece to the clothes pin as pictured. The large craft sticks should be placed on the top and bottom of the clothes pin clip and the rudder to the tip of one of the clothes pin "legs."

PLEASE NOTE: A good size blob of glue is needed and can be a little slippery until it dries, so be sure to wait for the glue to dry between each addition.



3. Now you're ready for take-off!
