Supplies in kit

• 2 paper cups ready to be decorated for you to make the fanciest cup and string telephone ever!

What you'll need from home

color markers, pencils, or crayons glue stick or liquid school glue

Directions

1. Begin by coloring the paper cup.



- 2. Next find a friend to try out the telephone with! Each person should take a cup and pull in opposite directions until the string is pulled as tight as it can be without breaking through the bottom of the cup.
- 3. One person talks into the cup, and the other will place their cup up to their ear and listen. It's fun to hear a voice coming from the paper cup!
