3-D DOG!

The days from July 3 to August 11 are known as the “dog days,” when summer is at its hottest. This 3-D dog craft will be just right for one of those days when we all want to stay inside out of the “dog day” heat!



Supplies in kit

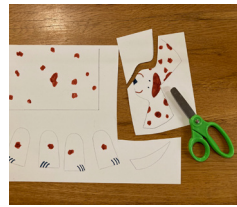
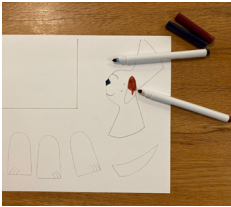
- 1 paper towel tube
- dog template

What you'll need from home

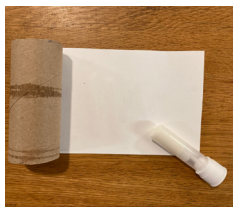
- glue stick or liquid school glue
- sticky tape
- colored markers, crayons, or pencils
- scissors

Directions

1. Color all of the parts of your dog with as many colors as you'd like! Then cut out each piece.



2. Take the rectangular piece of paper, and tape it to the side of the paper tube. Add glue to the rest of the paper, and wrap it around the tube. Add more tape to help keep it wrapped around the tube.



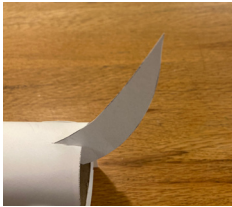
3. Fold the dog's head in half, then open it up and add glue to just the edges that will be glued on each side to the dog's body as pictured.



4. Carefully glue the legs on to each side of the dog's body, making sure that they are even, so that the dog will stand up. When the glue has set you may want to gently fold them out just a tiny bit make it balance.



5. Snip a slit on the backside of the dog and tuck in the tale as pictured. Now it's time to name this little "hot" dog!
