ROCKY THE WALRUS!

This little walrus can rock from side to side and would like very much to stay at home with you for the winter!



Supplies in kit

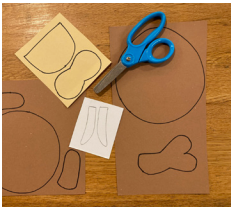
- walrus body template that includes an oval body, two flippers, and a tail, as well as a plain circle that will be the “rocker”
- mustache and chest template
- template with 2 tusks
- nose
- 2 white and black eye dots
- red beanie and large white dot pompom

What you'll need from home

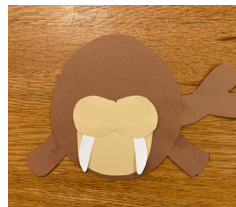
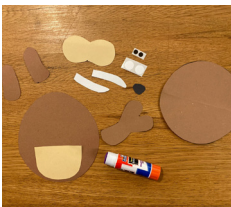
- scissors
- glue stick or liquid school glue
- colored markers, pencils, or crayons

Directions

1. Cut out the walrus body, flippers, and tail, plus the circle.



2. Cut out the mustache, chest, and tusks and glue them onto the body. Glue the flippers and tail to back side of the body.



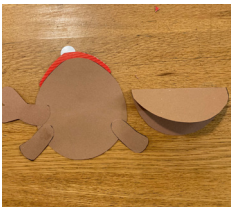
3. Add the nose and eyes to Rocky's face and the red beanie to Rocky's head. Pop on the pompom!



4. Add some whisker dots to Rocky's mustache.



5. Finally fold the circle in half and glue it to the the bottom half of the back side of the walrus as pictured; this is Rocky's "rocker". Stand Rocky up and gently tap a flipper to make him rock from side to side!
